IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW YORK STATE SCHOOLS

New York State laws require that each child entering school have a recent physical examination and be immunized either by vaccine or contact. Proof must be presented to school officials at the time of enrollment. It is required that this form be filled out and signed by your Doctor. You will not be allowed to attend school in New York State unless you have been inoculated as described below.

DIPHTHERIA, PERTUSSIS, & TETANUS – DPT - 3 doses of Diphtheria toxoid-containing vaccine (DTaP, DTP, DT, Tdap, Td)

TETANUS, DIPHTHERIA AND PERTUSSIS VACCINE BOOSTER – Tdap – 1 dose required

POLIOMYELITIS – IPV or OPV -- 3 doses

MEASLES (2) MUMPS (1) & RUBELLA (1): 2 doses of measles-containing vaccine, 1 dose of mumps-containing vaccine and 1 dose of rubella. The first dose must be after the child's first birthday. Second dose must be at least 28 days after first dose. See Note A.

HEPATITIS B – 3 doses. *For students starting the Hep B series as adolescents (currently with no Hep B doses), the catch-up schedule is 2 doses separated by 4 weeks and the 3rd dose 8 weeks after the 2nd dose. There should be at least 16 weeks between dose 1 and dose 3. See Note A.

VARICELLA (Chickenpox) - 1 dose. See Note A.

MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE (MenACWY) – **For students entering grade 12 only: 2 doses. For those who had 1 prior dose at age 16+, only 1 additional dose required. If 1st dose was prior to age 16, 2nd dose required; at least 8 weeks between doses. If student had 2 doses prior to age 16, a 3rd dose is required. No requirement for grades 10 or 11.

Recommended: Tetanus immunization **should be current** for your protection. Discuss this with your doctor.

Note A: Positive titers are acceptable proof of immunity for measles, mumps, rubella, Hepatitis B or varicella. Physician must supply dates.

Note B: If vaccinations are necessary after your arrival in District 7210, you will be responsible for any charges.

PLEASE NOTE: Tuberculosis screening – Although not required by New York State, some schools in Rotary District 7210 require the Mantoux/PPD skin test for TB. Your application for Rotary International Youth Exchange program includes this as part of the medical information. If you have not already had your TB screening, please ask your doctor to do so as soon as possible and complete this statement:

New York State requires all exchange students to have a physical exam, performed by a New York State registered doctor. Please be prepared to pay for this exam.
